

FES

Breakfast at the hotel. The whole day will be devoted to visit the cultural, artistic & spiritual city Fes precisely the Old Medina that has been listed a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1981.

We will start stroll in the "medina" (the medieval city) from The Blue Gate Bab Boujloud then continue walking down through the winding cobblestone narrow street to explore the jealously-guarded secret places that has been restored from ruins (Thanks to UNESCO, the World Bank and

the Ministry of Culture) including the Karaouine Mosque (outside view only), the magnificent Nejjarine Fountain and many beautiful constructions.

Enjoy a typical lunch at Moroccan local restaurant. The afternoon you may discover an important part of the Moroccan traditional urban architecture, with an optional Moorish mosaic workshop.

DAY 04

FES - VOLUBILIS - MEKNES - RABAT

Breakfast at the hotel. Take the bus to Volubilis | Roman Ruins (entrance). Bear witness to the grandeur of the former residence of King Juba II.

It was identified by the French archaeologist Charles Tissot in 1874 and it has been listed a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1997 for being "an exceptionally well-preserved example of a large Roman colonial town on the fringes of the Empire".

Drive to Meknes "The Moroccan Versailles". Visit Bab Mansour, Old Medina.

Then continue to visit the Zouina Winery. start by a guided

The Ouled Taleb estate in the Benslimane region, founded in 1926, 50 km north-east of Casablanca, is the oldest wine cellar still in activity in the Kingdom. The estate carried out its first harvest in 1927.

In 1968, Thalvin was created and operated the cellar of the Ouled Thaleb estate on nearly 500 hectares, planted only with noble grape varieties of French origin. The Domaine des Ouled Thaleb understood from its beginnings that the future of Moroccan wine is no longer the wine industry, but in the era of cooperative estates and cellars.

Preferring quality over yield, noble grape varieties, such as Syrah, the estate is a pioneer in the art of viticulture in Morocco.





Moroccan Cuisine

Enjoy A Cooking Class



The secret of moroccan gastronomic art lies in the skilful dosage of a mixture of spices.

Moroccan cuisine is characterized by its variety of dishes mainly from Berber cuisine, with Arab, Jewish and Andalusian influences.

Despite its common features with the cuisines of other North African countries, Moroccan cuisine has retained its originality and unique cultural specificities.

Known for its aromas, spices and the hospitality of its inhabitants, Morocco is increasingly coveted for its cuisine. An art closely linked to the history and customs of the country.

From international rankings to international rankings, Moroccan cuisine has become one of the attractions of the

Kingdom. Many travelers around the world praise the variety of dishes, which come from many backgrounds and various influences.

Moroccan cuisine reflects the history of the country and the different populations who have settled there. The tagine comes from the Berbers; these brought dates, milk, cereals, bread, almonds, fruits and herbs. The Arabs brought spices, dried fruits, nuts and bitter-sweet combinations; the Moors introduced olives, its oil and citrus fruits while the Jews notably shared their preservation techniques such as those of candied lemons or pickles, not to mention the British who, in the eighteenth century, imported the famous tea and the colonists French

who have left behind a culture of cafes, pastries and even wine making. But the two great imprints of Moroccan cuisine in fact remain the Arab and Andalusian influence.

Get the chance to experience our cooking class in Morocco, to share our traditions and culture. This opportunity is an enjoyable participation to discover the Moroccan cuisine and know the secrets of the best Moroccan recipes in an entertaining way.





Domaine Zouina stretches over 115 hectares. Cypress and olive trees surround and protect the vines in this ancient land that gives off an unique signature.

The vineyard houses a selection of the best grape varieties: syrah, cabernet sauvignon, tempranillo for red wines; chardonnay, sauvignon blanc, sauvignon gris, viognier and vermentino for white wines; caladoc, mourvèdre and marseelan for Rosés.

The material used in the cellar is worthy of the greatest « Châteaux » of Bordeaux: cold storage, sorting tables, process by gravity, vertical presses, concrete tanks of small capacity, where a special care is given to preserve the integrity of the harvest, to protect its aromas and to prevent oxidation phenomena. In this cellar, the


traditional know-how matches perfectly the french mastery...

The aging of whites wines last 4 months and the red one 15 months. We bottle them at the end of winter. The fermentation and aging of great vintages (Epicuria Chardonnay, Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah) take place in barrels made of french oak.

The Olives trees
Planted in the early twentieth century, the 4000 olive trees protect the vineyard from the capricious chergui. The olives are harvested by hand, sorted and crushed within the four hours after the harvest.

The oil produced is of the highest quality: Extra Virgin Volubilia was awarded in 2006 as the world's best olive oil and in 2008 as the best foreign olive oil by Italian guides.





Moorish Mosaic Workshop

Also called Zellij-Tilework



Moorish Mosaic, Moroccan Tilework or Zellige or Zillij is a typically Moroccan Art Form, which has been gratefully preserved by Families of Moroccan master's form generations back to the 10th century, thanks to their love of work well done, nobility of materials selected, and full mastery of required know-how.

A whole series of stages must be accomplished before handing over the piece to its decorator.

The craftsman unifies the clay paste with his arms and feet, making it less stiff, then the pieces are split into blocks and hardened again under sun light and flattened with a bat. Then, parts of 10x10 cm are obtained and placed under sun light for as

long as it took to fully dry, which corresponded to the first burnt stage.

Afterwards, these pieces are submersed into a coloring, containing a mixture of lead, sand and other oxides that promote the desired color. This mixture is applied together with water, which help the process of dying.

The pieces are then submitted to a firing process in an oven and they are placed in it according to an order: the ones with white surfaces on the bottom (exposed directly to heat) and on the top the green ones (which are more sensitive to the firing process).

An important step of the whole manufacturing process is,

afterwards, when the artisan draws onto the pieces using drawn and cut molds of paper. In the end, all pieces are rearranged according to their shape and color.

The Zellige is used to cover and ornate walls floors as an important element of Arab-Andalusian architecture which has been able to adapt to contemporary styles of decoration while preserving an artisanal manufacturing method.

A workshop, led by masters in traditional Moorish Mosaic, called Zellige, to learn about fes pottery and assemble by yourself the intricate color pieces, for a worthy challenge and a joyful entertaining.

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


